The Value of a Customized Education

We are not focused on how smart a student is when he arrives as a freshman; we measure our school's success on his growth over four years and his ability to succeed in college and beyond.

Many schools are moving toward our strategy of customized education, but we have a 175-year head start on where they are trying to go. Every student is challenged and we modify pace and rigor to reach every Cadet.

Eight years ago, CBC initiated the use of a nationally recognized testing platform developed by the Northwest Evaluation Association, or NWEA. Given two times per year, the Measures of Academic Progress (M.A.P.) test is used to assess the growth of all students in the core areas of Math and Language Arts.

CBC student test results have been quite impressive. On average and regardless of their test scores entering high school, CBC students are achieving academic growth at rates far beyond the national average.

Stand-outs in various areas, our students excel in Academics, Athletics, Fine & Performing Arts and many other clubs, such as Robotics and Model United Nations. Some young men enter CBC as members of the CBC Honors Program, others come to us with average test scores, and still others utilize the many academic support programs available to our students.

Young men come to us from a variety of backgrounds and hold many different strengths. NWEA test scores show us that our teachers are connecting with young men at all academic levels. We are not focused on how smart a student is when he arrives as a freshman; we measure our school's success on his growth over four years and his ability to succeed in college and beyond.

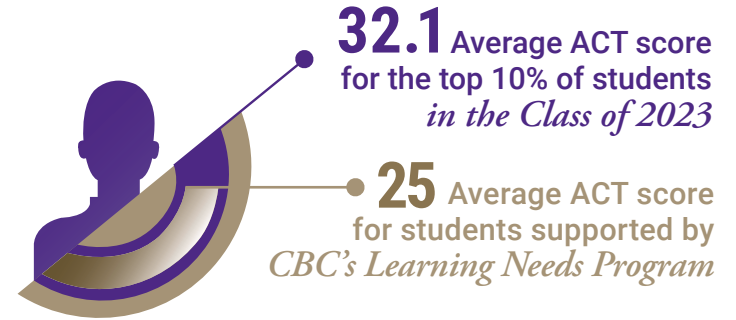

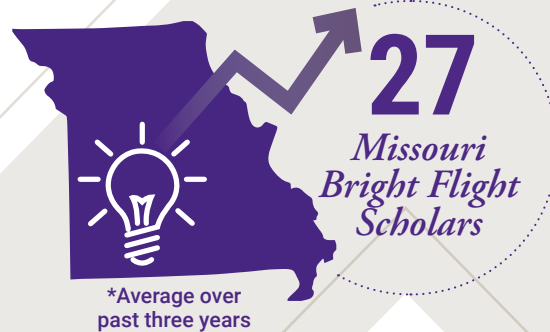

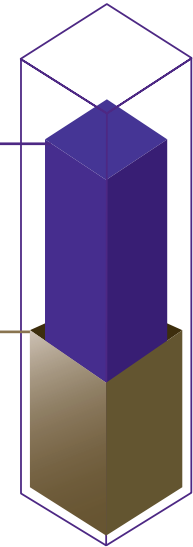

The CBC Honors Program

The CBC Honors Program inspires, challenges, and empowers learners as they pursue their passions and prepare for success in a constantly evolving global community.

Invitations to participate are based on grades, placement tests, teacher recommendations, interviews, and each student's interest in being inspired and challenged in new ways.

From their first days on campus, participants are placed in honors, Advanced Placement, and college dual-enrollment courses as they prepare to succeed at the most competitive universities in America.

CBC Honors Program participants build and display a portfolio of work and experiences gathered over four years. Projects pursued are unique to the skills and passions of each young man, with guidance provided by on-campus faculty as well as industry experts.

Student projects have included entrepreneurial start-ups, development of robots with artificial intelligence, foreign language fluency, and investing hundreds of hours to become glider pilot certified.

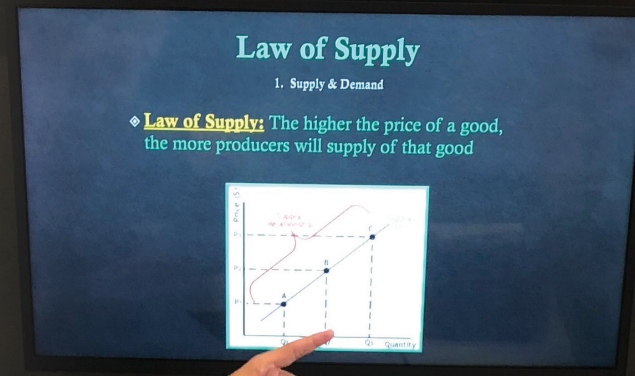
A full-time Learning Specialist works with students and families while additional help in all academic subjects is available through a variety of resources. The purpose and mission of the Learning Needs Program is to provide the support necessary so that students from a diverse range of academic backgrounds can learn and succeed at CBC.

CBC's Cadet Learning Center (CLC) is available to all students and offers academic support from faculty, National Honor Society students, and CBC's Tutorial Support Program.

The CLC is also a testing center for make-up tests and for students with testing accommodations. Open before, during and after school every day, the CLC is an important part of our commitment to helping all students succeed.

Preparation for College

Preparing our students for success in college and beyond is a focus point for everyone on our campus. Recent graduates have found success at Stanford, Yale, Cornell, Duke, Notre Dame, West Point, United States Naval Academy, Vanderbilt, Washington University in St. Louis, Brown, Rice, Georgetown and many other universities. While our faculty prepares students in the classroom, CBC's Counseling Department opens each young man's eyes to the academic opportunities available beyond high school.

We were the first school to offer an ACT Prep course during the school day and we host one of the largest college fairs in the Midwest. These are just two examples of our commitment to helping our young men win the best academic opportunities available. Helping Cadets apply for and earn college scholarship dollars is also a focus as we support your college search. Throughout the process, we stay in constant contact with students and families regarding the college admissions process through an online tool called Naviance Family Connection.

Ultimately, we want to help you find the perfect fit for your college years. We are here to support you through all phases of the process.

CBC Innovation Commons

8,000 square-foot space focuses on the skills industries need most

The CBC Innovation Commons offers more than 8,000 square-feet of space to inspire 21st century learning and experimentation. This best-in-class facility is home to the CBC STEM Academy as well as our Center for Leadership and Entrepreneurship. Industry leaders have identified these three skill sets as areas of significant need in the work force, and CBC is the first school in the St. Louis area to formally connect these rapidly growing career paths.

Virtual reality technology, drone development, flight simulation, and a new robotics arena are now available to our students. These examples only begin to scratch the surface of the new capabilities offered in this innovative learning space. Technology-rich labs, presentation spaces, and collaboration areas are allowing our teachers to introduce real-world experiences to our curriculum in all areas of academic study. This investment is just one example of CBC's commitment to remaining on the leading-edge of education innovation.

CBC STEM ACADEMY

Members of CBC's faculty hold more than six decades of industry experience as professional engineers. The CBC STEM Academy is leveraging that real-world experience to equip our students with the skills necessary to identify and solve the challenges of tomorrow. Faculty guidance and mentorships developed through the support of industry partnerships are providing our young men with real-world experience that will set them apart from the competition.

Industry partnerships and student co-curricular opportunities have been developed with Mastercard, IBM, Boeing, World Wide Technology, Saint Louis University, Fontbonne University, Maryville University, and more!

CBC LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The CBC Leadership Program is at the center of the school's commitment to building men for tomorrow who are prepared to lead and serve. Courses introduce students to the character traits and skills essential to providing strong leadership. The program culminates in a senior level class called Leadership in Action. This course provides our young men the opportunity to share what they have learned by serving as mentors to grade school students who will become our next generation of leaders.

Students participate in intramurals, hold student club meetings or just grab a snack at the Cadet Canteen with friends. This is a great time to establish and build friendships that will last a lifetime.

THE CADET CUP

Other schools attempt to imitate, but they can't compete with the excitement of CBC's Cadet Cup competition! The Cadet Cup was established by our Student Leadership Council in 2009 and drives our unmatched school spirit. Our ten community teams compete in a variety of events within six categories: Activities, Mission, Spirit, Social, Academics, and Discipline. There are several prizes given to communities throughout the year and the competition culminates with the winning community receiving a day off school to attend a "mystery day" of food, games, and experiences..

Esports Program

EIGHT-TIME STATE CHAMPIONS

Opened in the fall of 2019, CBC's Esports (electronic sports) Center includes 54 gaming stations and more than 1,500 square-feet of space for students to work together and challenge each other. This new program makes CBC a national leader in the delivery of esports opportunities at the high school level.

Student interest in this activity is astronomically high, and our co-curricular program will provide young men with opportunities to sharpen their critical thinking skills and work as a team, while also gaining experience in a rapidly emerging industry.
