


CHRISTIAN SERVICE AND FAITH FORMATION AT CBC



Christian Brothers College is a Catholic, Lasallian high school founded on the mission of Saint John Baptist de La Salle and the Brothers of the Christian Schools. De La Salle was called by God to provide a human and Christian education to the young – particularly the poor – so all might realize their own salvation (living an abundant and meaningful life here on earth and eternally in heaven). Faithful to De La Salle’s vision, CBC strives to form Men for Tomorrow who are guided by faith, strengthened by intellect, committed to justice, and prepared to lead and serve.

Christian Service at CBC

Over the course of his career, each CBC student will complete a minimum of 114 hours of Christian Service, with yearly requirements:

- **Freshman and Sophomores** must complete 16 hours of community service, with at least 8 of those hours in the first semester.
- **Juniors** will complete an intensive 50-hour project of direct, interpersonal service to those in need in May of their junior year. Most students complete these projects in the St. Louis area, but some choose to apply for [CBC Mission Trips](#).
- **Seniors** will complete a 32-hour project of direct, interpersonal service to those in need over the course of their senior year.



With the exception of the Junior Project, hours may be completed the summer prior to a given year, so members of the incoming Class of 2026 could complete their required freshman hours over the summer before their freshman year even begins! - Four-year religious education curriculum

- Opportunities for fellowship with other Lasallian schools in the Midwest District
- Regular opportunities for Confession, especially during Advent and Lent.
